
A research-driven approach to fixed-income investing focused on risk management and capital preservation.

The Fund: This offering provides investors with a core bond position in the broad fixed-income market. The Fund utilizes the entire investment-grade fixed-income spectrum, which may include U.S. government securities,  $mortgage-backed\ securities\ (including\ commercial\ mortgage-backed\ securities),\ corporate\ bonds,\ asset-backed$ securities and money market instruments.

The Approach: We employ fundamental and quantitative analysis to construct a diversified Fund. Our macroeconomic analysis and risk assessment provides the framework for determining asset allocation. Fundamental bottom-up credit research is the foundation of our investment process

The Features: The Fund seeks to protect against downside risks while maintaining upside potential, consistent with the Fund's investment objectives to seek current income and total return. We seek to deliver competitive returns, emphasizing relative value and risk management to potentially provide a stabilizing influence in a client's diversified investment program.





**DEFINITIONS:** Average maturity – weighted average of the maturities of the underlying securities in the portfolio. A bond's average price is calculated by adding its face value to the price paid for it and dividing the sum by two. The average price is sometimes used in determining a bond's yield to maturity where the average price replaces the purchase price in the yield to maturity calculation. **Effective duration** measures a portfolio's sensitivity to changes in interest rates when a portfolio contains bonds with features such as puts and calls. Generally, the longer the effective duration, the greater the price change relative to interestrate movements. **Number of holdings** provided are a typical range, not a maximum number. The portfolio may exceed this from time to time due to market conditions and outstanding trades. **SEC yield** is a measure of the income generated by the portfolio's underlying asset over the trailing 30 days, relative to the asset base of the portfolio itself. The **SEC 30-day yield subsidized** reflects current fee waivers in effect. Absent such fee waivers, the yield would have been lower. The **SEC 30-day yield unsubsidized** does not reflect the fee waivers currently in effect.

INDEX INFORMATION: The Bloomberg U.S. Aggregate Bond Index is an index made up of the Bloomberg U.S. Government/Corporate Bond Index, Mortgage-Backed Securities Index, and Asset-Based Securities Index, including securities that are of investment grade quality or better, have at least one year to maturity, and have an outstanding par value of at least \$100 million.

Ratings: The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and openended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods. Ratings do not take into account sales loads.

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**OTHER CONSIDERATIONS:** Total net assets equals the sum of the net assets of each of the Fund's share classes. Portfolio total net assets includes fund total net assets plus any additional assets invested in the Portfolio.
